About the event

Title: Social Economy Conference: Skills, Visibility & Funding

Date: Friday 3rd November 2023 from 9am to 4.30pm.

Type of event/Venue: In person. Ashling Hotel, Dublin, IRELAND.

The launch event for baSE has been included within a bigger event focused on Social Economy organised by The Wheel.

The target audience for this event were workers and board members from Social Economy organisations, VET providers, sector experts and volunteers.

The baSE focused part of the event gathered 44 people.

We were honoured to have Sarah De Heusch, Director of Social Economy Europe deliver the keynote speech.

The baSE project in the spotlight

As "Skills" was one of the three main themes of the conference, the baSE project was presented, mentioned and/or included in several parts of the event.

1. Parallel Session: "Social Economy Skills Needs"

Gathering over 30 participants, this session lasted 90min and included three 10-min presentations:

- 1. The baSE project: General Aims & Approach Sarah de Heusch, Director of Social Economy Europe
- 2. How to Identify Skills Strengths among your staff and volunteers Mateja Jaksic, Skills Summary Project Co-ordinator, National Youth Council of Ireland
- 3. Guidance on reviewing organisational skills needs, skills audits and training opportunities available through your local ETB Margaret Corbett, Employer Engagement Officer, City of Dublin Education and Training Board





Sarah de Heusch opened this parallel session on the topic "Social Economy Skills Needs" by presenting the baSE project to the participants.

After a short Q&A with the speakers, the participants worked in small groups on a worksheet to discuss Skills Needs, Audits and Training Opportunities. The session concluded with the participants' feedback and final words from Mairead O'Connor, Skills Development Snr Manager, The Wheel.

The one-hour panel was moderated by The Wheel's Skills Development Senior Manager, Mairead O'Connor. The audience also had the opportunity to ask skills-related questions to the panel. After the panel, participants could gather ideas and feedback at their table during a 20-minyte table discussion.




