## Background and concept

The **Blueprint for Social Economy and Proximity Skills & Advanced Trainings Schemes Adaptable to diverse Social Economy Ecosystem in Europe** – [baSE project](#) was launched to address skills gaps and anticipate future competences needed in the social economy and proximity sectors across Europe. Over four years (2022-26) the consortium has worked to:



### **1. Strategic outcomes:**

- SocioComp Framework
- Occupational Profiles (OPs)
- Policy recommendations

### **2. Learning & Training infrastructure**

- MOOC platform: 10 courses
- European catalogue of 29 courses
- Training curricula tested in 10 EU countries

### **3. Digital & knowledge tools**

- The SE Insider, a Social Economy Magazine
- An online monitoring tool, the base-Watch
- An open interactive map with VET for social economy

The final event marks the culmination of this collective effort and **targets** young people and students (VET and university level), VET providers and trainers, universities and higher education, SE practitioners and networks, industry representatives, EU and national policymakers, project stakeholders and partners. It will serve as **a European conference web-streamed from Brussels** to present key results and hands-on workshops, discussing together how to sustain and scale outcomes beyond the project's lifetime.
